

If Part of Your Power Isn't Working...

Before submitting a maintenance request, there are a couple of quick things you should check:

1. **Check Your Breakers:**

Go to your breaker panel and flip each breaker OFF and then back ON to reset them. Sometimes a tripped breaker isn't obvious until it's fully reset.

2. **Check for a Tripped GFCI Outlet:**

GFCI (Ground Fault Circuit Interrupter) outlets are usually found in bathrooms, kitchens, and laundry areas. These outlets have small buttons on them — usually labeled "**Reset**" and "**Test**".

- If moisture or an electrical surge has triggered it, the GFCI will trip and shut off power to any connected outlets.
- Simply press the **Reset** button to restore power.
- Be sure to check nearby outlets — GFCIs can control multiple outlets and may even be on the other side of a wall.

Taking these quick steps can often solve the problem without the need for a maintenance visit!
